

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO STANDARDS FOR HOME EDUCATION REIMBURSEMENT

<u>Allowable Expenses</u> for Home Education Reimbursement	
Current (2016/17 School Year)	Updates (Effective Sept. 1, 2017)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Internet services – 50% of monthly fee 	<p>Include full school year from September to August; previously covered September to June</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tutoring 	<p>Tutoring can be done by a subject matter expert who is not an immediate family member</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lessons 	<p>Limited to 50% of parent’s funding; includes music lessons and private lessons</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tangible assets 	<p>Limited to 50% of parent’s funding; includes musical instruments and physical education equipment</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Admissions/field trips 	<p>Limited to 50% of parent’s funding</p> <p>Added multiuse recreation facilities</p> <p>Clarified that families can purchase family admission when it is less expensive than purchasing individual student passes</p> <p>Removed the condition that the pass should be reimbursed on a prorated basis</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Postage/shipping and handling from vendors to the home education family 	<p>To clarify the message previously provided</p>

• Musical instruments/rental	Added to allowable expenses (portion)
• Physical activity equipment/rental	Added to allowable expenses (portion)
• Admission for recreational activities like ski passes or a multiuse facility passes	Added to allowable expenses (portion)
• Registration fees – including, but not limited to, sports teams, community leagues and summer camps	Added to clarify the message previously provided
