

WHY LEARN A LANGUAGE?

As our world becomes increasingly connected and interdependent, it has become necessary for students to learn the skills to effectively communicate with others around the world.

Learning a language benefits students in the following ways:

Academic and Intellectual Achievement

- Students have higher test scores in reading, language and mathematics
- Students score higher in both verbal and non-verbal intelligence
- Students are better in divergent thinking tasks and in memory ability and attention span

Post-Secondary Admission

- Language courses may be used to meet the Alberta High School Diploma requirements. Up to 25 credits of the 100 credits required for a high school diploma can be earned in one or more second language
- A 30-level language course is accepted for university entrance and is a requirement for some faculties and programs. It may also help students meet the requirements for the Rutherford scholarship
- Students can continue to study Ukrainian in some postsecondary institutions

Enhanced First Language Skills

 Students' first language skills are strengthened in areas of reading, vocabulary development, grammar and communication skills

Cultural Understanding

 Students display enhanced cultural sensitivity, gain crosscultural skills, and are better able to adapt to varying cultural contexts

Greater Career Opportunities

• There is a growing need for qualified speakers of languages other than English in areas of science, technology, medicine and global commerce



Alberta school authorities benefit from the expertise and assistance of a Special Language Advisor for Ukrainian Language and Culture through an agreement between

Alberta Education and the Department of Education and Science of Lyiv Oblast State Administration.

The Ukrainian language advisor:

- Leads professional development sessions with Ukrainian language teachers
- Helps to develop and maintain strong relationships with Alberta schools that offer Ukrainian language and culture programs
- Provides support for partnership projects between Alberta schools that offer the Ukrainian program and secondary schools in the Lviv region

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DID YOU KNOW?

- Ukrainian language and culture education has been a part of Alberta schools since 1902
- The first provincial curriculum for Ukrainian as a second language in Alberta schools was introduced in 1956
- According to the 2011 census, more than 29,500 Albertans reported Ukrainian to be their mother tongue
- Alberta and Lviv became sister provinces in 2005
- In celebration of 125 years of Ukrainian immigration to Canada, 2016–2017 was declared 'Alberta's Year of the Ukrainian Canadian'
- Passed in 2016, the Ukrainian–Canadian Heritage Act designates Sept. 7 as Ukrainian–Canadian Heritage Day



In Alberta, Ukrainian language programing includes:

- Bilingual programs, where in addition to Language Arts (Kindergarten to Grade 12), Ukrainian is used for instruction in other subjects up to a total of 50% of the school day, and
- Language and Culture courses, where Ukrainian is studied to develop communication skills, intercultural and strategic competence and an appreciation of Ukrainian culture

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY EXAMS

Ukrainian Language Exam for International Students

- is developed by Ivan Franko National University of Lviv in collaboration with University of Alberta
- Measures proficiency of students who graduate from Ukrainian Bilingual Programs in Grades 11 – 12
- Assesses oral and written competencies
- Provides students with international credentials throughout the course of their studies
- Is administered by the Ukrainian Language Education Centre (ULEC) and Alberta Education's Ukrainian Language Advisor at the University of Alberta
