



Along with a high standard of living, Alberta has no provincial sales tax.

Alberta's size and diversity provides a wide variety of cultural, recreational, and entertainment opportunities. From skiing, cycling, and hiking to camping and sightseeing, Alberta offers outstanding outdoor adventures. The hundreds of yearly festivals and cultural events, fantastic galleries and museums, and fabulous shopping and leisure activities present many opportunities for fun and excitement.

# Alberta – A World Class Primary and Secondary Education System

Alberta schools offer high-quality curriculum that is recognized world-wide. The Alberta standardized curriculum is developed to meet the needs of students, now and in the future. Alberta teachers are dedicated professionals who inspire and challenge our students to find their passion for learning and achieve their potential in school and throughout life.

The Ministry of Education (also known as Alberta Education) supports the needs of students, parents, teachers, and administrators from Early Childhood Services (ECS) through Grade 12. Alberta has public schools, separate schools, Francophone schools, charter schools, private schools, and virtual schools. These schools are part of the public education system. distance learning, and blended programs are other educational options available to students. Alberta has 63 school authorities of which 20 admit international students.

The Alberta High School Diploma is accepted by admissions officers of universities and post-secondary institutions throughout the world. Resources to support the delivery of curriculum in the classroom are diverse, accessible, and current, providing students and teachers with strong interactive technology supports to enhance the teaching and learning experience.

International students in Alberta have many opportunities to excel both on an academic and personal basis for a well-rounded but individualized educational experience. Alberta schools allow students to explore their personal interests through diverse course offerings or to participate in after-school related activities such as sports or chess clubs.

International students in Alberta have a strong network of support. School authorities can help students find a suitable school and living accommodations. The student's school provides support through teachers, school staff, and/or professional counselors to overcome any problems they may encounter while adjusting to life in Alberta.

Friendly people, reasonable tuition fees, safe communities, and schools that focus on success for every student no matter where in the province they reside make Alberta one of the world's best places to live and study.



## **Application Process**

#### Step 1 - Research and explore education opportunities

To have the optimal education experience, you will want to find the program that best fits your needs and goals. There are several things to consider as you evaluate what program is right for you. Some factors to consider include location, program length, specialized programs, admission requirements, and cost. The individual school authority profiles provide you with information that will be useful in your decision-making process.

#### Step 2 - Find a school you would like to attend

Alberta has created school authorities to oversee the education of students living in our cities and towns. They are also responsible for the admission and registration of all students in their area of responsibility, including international students.

Once you've decided where in Alberta you wish to study, contact the local school authority, who will help find the right school and program for you. School authority staff will outline the various English language learning supports available and find an appropriate combination of academic and options courses for you. They will also provide you with the necessary forms and guide you through their application process.

#### Step 3 - Apply to the school authority

The application process varies from one school authority to another, but generally students are required to submit the following to complete the application process:

- ► Application fee (varies with each school authority)
- ► A letter of reference from your current principal
- Your most recent report card
- A copy of your academic record (transcripts) for the last two years
- Custodianship documents

#### Step 4 - Pay your tuition fees

Once your application is accepted by the school authority, they will issue you a letter of acceptance. After you receive this letter, you may pay your tuition fees to the appropriate school authority. Fees and payment procedures for international students vary according to school authority. Contact the local school authority for more details.

#### Step 5 - Apply for your study permit

You are now ready to apply for your study permit. You will need to include your letter of acceptance as part of your study permit application. Study permits are issued by Government of Canada. To learn the steps you will need to follow, please visit **www.cic.gc.ca**.


