The aim of the Cree language and culture programs of study is the development of communicative competence in Cree.

#### **Four Components**

For the purposes of the program of studies, communicative competence is represented by four interrelated and interdependent components.

**Applications** deal with what the students will be able to do with the language, the functions they will be able to perform and the contexts in which they will be able to operate.

**Language Competence** addresses the students' knowledge of the language and their ability to use that knowledge to interpret and produce meaningful texts appropriate to the situations in which they are used.


Strategies help students learn and communicate more effectively and more efficiently.

**Global Citizenship** aims to develop intercultural competence, with a particular focus on Cree culture.

Each of these components is described more fully in the program of studies.





• Included in this document are lessons about two ceremonies. These lessons should be taught by an individual who is familiar with, and knowledgeable about, the ceremonies addressed.





This resource includes a student reader, a teacher guide, a communication activity book and a set of flash cards. The reader is a collection of stories that introduces Cree vocabulary to students in eight thematic units. The short dialogues are accompanied by pictures. The teacher guide provides a general introduction, instructional objectives, suggested teaching approaches, a detailed pronunciation guide, content descriptions, evaluation suggestions and activity book answers. The communication activity book contains many different activities designed to help students practice Cree. Activities include a conversation matrix, role-plays, word search and matching words, fill-in-the-blanks, rhythm poems and cryptic message translations. The flash cards supplement the vocabulary and stories.

#### Annotation:

This resource includes a communication activity book, a student reader and a teacher guide. The communication activity book contains six units with a variety of activities, including assessment tools. This coil bound book could be used by students as a workbook. Themes and topics include: telling time, giving directions, shopping, visiting, camping and pow-wow and will engage the students. #### Annotation:

This resource was written by the Whitefish Lake First Nation and contains 22 Plains Cree language units that focus on day-to-day activities; e.g., shopping, months, colours, family. Included in each unit is cultural awareness information, notes to the teacher, vocabulary, activities, songs, games, dialogues, a quiz and an explanation of grammatical structures.

#### Comments:

- A game on page 9 could have a negative effect on the motivation to learn. Teachers are encouraged to adapt the game before using it.
- References to the treatment of animals are historically correct but could serve to reinforce negative stereotypes.
- The resource contains some words for "hate" and teachers are encouraged to replace these with words for "dislike".
